



DECLARATION OF FINANCIAL SPONSORSHIP

Students intending to enter the U.S. on an F-1 visa and/or attend Franklin University in F-1 immigration status must demonstrate that they have sufficient funding for at least the first year of their studies to be admitted as a potential F-1 student. OISP sets minimum financial requirements based on the University's tuition rates and estimated living expenses. Potential students who are unable to demonstrate sufficient funding are eligible to be admitted to the University but will not be eligible to apply for an F-1 visa or immigration status. Please note that students who will be self-sponsoring must demonstrate at least two years of funding.

Financial Responsibility Statement

I understand the following information:

- Students are responsible for all expenses incurred at Franklin University; see payment policies in the [Academic Bulletin](#).
- Students who are unable to pay tuition may not be able to maintain enrollment as required to remain in legal status.
- Tuition and fees are subject to change without notice.
- F-1 students have limited work options in the United States and should not be expected to be able to pay tuition and living expenses from employment in the U.S.

ESTIMATED ANNUAL EXPENSES

Annual expenses assume 2 trimesters of full-time enrollment and 12 months of living expenses, including health insurance.

- Tuition: \$13,234
- Books & Supplies: \$1,080
- Health Insurance: \$1,380
- Living Expenses: \$28,548
- Total: \$44,242

F-1 applicants with dependents applying for F-2 visa and/or immigration status must, also, demonstrate sufficient funding for all dependents. Dependent expenses assume 12 months of living expenses, including insurance.
