FALL 2021 PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

SUPPORTING EVERY STUDENT

The Franklin University Learning Commons worked on several projects during the Fall 2021 term to improve the student experience, expand services, and support academic programs.

SMARTHINKING OVERFLOW

The Learning Commons expanded our tutoring overflow options for during FA21. To
ensure students' needs are being met, we have partnered with Smarthinking to offer an
overflow tutoring option. Students will have the option to request a Smarthinking
tutoring appointment if there are no Franklin tutoring appointments available or if they
need to schedule a daytime/off-hours appointment. For the fall term, students enrolled
in math, accounting and computer science courses had the option to request a
Smarthinking appointment.

LIBKEY NOMAD

The library began a LibKey Nomad trial in FA21. LibKey Nomad automatically provides
instant links to full text content for articles subscribed to by the library or unrestricted
access alternatives. As students conduct research on the web and find literature via
Google, it automatically scans for full text access to scholarly content. This does require
installation of a <u>free plug-in</u> and selecting Franklin as their home institution. As of SP21,
we have moved from a trial to full adoption of this service via OhioLINK.

REPURCHASE REVIEW FOR MISSING BOOKS

The library team conducted a review of all missing or damaged books. This review
consisted of determining whether these books should be replaced and made available
in our print collection. Several factors were considered including date of publication,
availability via OhioLINK, relevancy to our curriculum, and if the material is a seminal
work. We repurchased 15% of the books reviewed.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS (CONT.)

NURSING PROFICIENCY TESTING

 Testing worked to coordinate a new option for nursing students by partnering with Nursing, HESI, and ProctorU to implement testing process and procedures for incoming graduate students. Students who have taken previous courses have an opportunity to test their competencies using the HESI Exam in NURS 644 Advanced Pathophysiology; NURS 646 Advanced Physical Assessment; and, NURS 648 Advanced Pharmacology. Students who pass this competency exam can avoid retaking a course.

TITLE III GRANT TUTORING COLLABORATION

• In collaboration with the Title III Grant commission, a study analyzing the effects of embedded tutoring in a course showed promising results. We saw that the number of required appointments attended is significantly related to the overall grade. For ENG 101, every required tutoring appointment a student attended resulted in a 3.81-point increase in their grade. We also learned that 6 tutoring appointments per term seems to be the most effective for Franklin students.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS (CONT.)

REFERENCE SERVICES DATA DASHBOARD

 In an effort to better understand our reference services impact on students, our Scholarly Communications and Research Librarian compiled multiple datasets in a LibInsights dashboard. We've highlighted some of the data for FA21 below.



In FA21 we spent a total of **3 days, 14** hours, and **35 minutes** using our LiveChat feature answering questions.



With 63 open hours, October was our peak month and Tuesdays were our most popular day. **78%** of questions were asked on week days.




In FA21, we had students in **104** different courses ask for assistance with the bulk of the questions coming from ENG800, PF 321, ENG 220, and MKTG 300.

REFERENCE SERVICES DATA DASHBOARD (CONT.)



We answer questions from a variety of patrons. This includes UG, GRAD, Doctoral, Faculty/Staff, Alumni, and Prospective Students/Applicants. In FA21, approximately 45% of questions were from UG Students.

FAST FACTS



\$1.8M+

Based on the national average, students have saved over an estimated \$1.8 million on textbooks since the library and OER textbook program began in Fall 2018.



23k+

As of Fall 2021, over 23,000 textbook purchases were replaced by library or OER textbooks.



29k+

During the Fall 2021 semester, there were over 29,000 visits to the Learning Commons website.



154k+

Library users have accessed over 154,000 unique titles via online PDFs or web based resources in Fall 2021.

ADDITIONAL HIGHLIGHTS



- In FA21, 130 courses were using Free via Library etextbooks, with 258 sections using 170 books.
- Approximately 97% of Interlibrary Loan requests were successfully filled in FA21.
- FUSE reached 6,450 total downloads of scholarly content created by Franklin faculty, staff, and students.



TESTING CENTER

- Testing supported 210 class exams, with over 3,000 testing sessions.
- Created 370 placement testing vouchers for incoming new students.
- Over \$5,000 revenue generated.



TUTORING

- For FA21, we saw an overall increase of 5% in occupied tutoring hours compared to FA20.
- 15% increase in Smarthinking tutoring sessions compared to FA20.
- 890 papers were reviewed by the Online Writing Review in FA21.
- 603 workshop registrations.
- 207 unique tutoring appointment users.
